



Census officers are distributing paper census forms

On 17 April 2021, the census officers started distributing the paper census forms to those households who have not got counted online yet. An example of a completed form you can find [here](#).

Although you have received this census paper form, you can still get counted online until 11 May. However, you must choose only one way how to be counted - online or via paper form. The paper forms are in Czech language only, however there are translations to other languages available which you can use.

The census officers have visibly placed their census ID card and they are obliged to demonstrate their ID card/passport too if they are asked.

The date and the time of census officer's visit will be pre-announced in common areas of your block of flats (e.g. entry door) or in your post box. The pre-announced time of visit cannot be changed. In case you will not be at home at the pre-announced time, you will be offered an alternative date and time of another visit. There is no third attempt of delivering the paper form. You can also pick up the paper form yourself on a contact place (the list of contact places in Ústí region you can find [here](#)).

The basic help to complete the form is available in each question.

How to complete the paper form correctly?

- Write the answers with black or blue pen only.
- Use capital letters only as it is shown in the example on the form.
- Write directly into the white boxes.
- Write only one character including its accent in each box.
- Use an abbreviation for long answers.
- In case there is a choice of more than one item, mark the correct answer with a cross.
- Unless stated otherwise, cross out only one option per question.
- If you make a mistake, cross the box out and write the correct answer next to it.

You can hand in the completed form in a contact place or send it in a census envelope which you have received together with the census paper form. The envelope has a pre-printed address and postage is free of charge.
