FORMS OF COMPLETING EDUCATION IN THE CZECH REPUBLIC

Completion of compulsory primary education is certified by a school

report. Pupils in primary schools and students in secondary schools receive their school reports twice a year.

Secondary school education concludes with one of the following: the Maturita exam, a final exam with a vocational certificate, or a final exam.

- **Maturita** a form of completing education at grammar schools and four-year programs at secondary vocational schools (SOŠ), as well as two- or three-year follow-up programs for graduates of vocational training schools. After passing the Maturita exam, students usually continue their studies at university.
 - **The maturita exam** consists of two parts. The first part includes the socalled CERMAT tests, which cover Czech language and literature, as well as either mathematics or a foreign language. The second part is determined individually by each school.
- **Vocational Certificate and Final Exam** The vocational certificate, along with the final exam, certifies the completion of a two- or three-year specialized program at a secondary vocational school (SOU). Education ending with a vocational certificate prepares students for a profession but does not qualify them to pursue university studies (a Maturita exam is required for this).
 - The final exam consists of both oral and practical components. Upon successful completion, students are awarded a vocational certificate.
 - An option to later obtain the Maturita qualification with this type of education is through follow-up study programs, which conclude with the Maturita exam.

Final exam without a vocational certificate - this applies to practical schools, which are designed for students with intellectual disabilities or special educational needs.

University education is concluded with a state final examination.

- In addition to the oral part, the state final exam includes the submission and defense of a bachelor's, master's, or doctoral thesis.
- Upon receiving a university diploma, graduates are entitled to use the academic title specified on the diploma.
- The university diploma is accompanied by a supplement that provides an overview of the completed study program.
